He has appeared in over 20 plays in the Los Angeles area and has become an accomplished playwright, director and producer. In 2006, he made one of his dreams a reality when he built and founded The Sherry Theater (named after his mother) in the heart of the North Hollywood Arts District. Scott wrote, directed, and acted in the critically acclaimed plays "Devil's Night" and "Angel Asylum." The feature film versions of these plays are currently in development.

In addition, Scott has recently acted in the suspense feature thriller "Tunnel Vision", worked opposite of Laurence Fishburne on "CSI" and childhood friend Jim Parrack (True Blood) in James Franco's stage and filmed version of the Sam Shepard play "True West", and was fortunate to land the leading role in the feature film POST which won him Best Supporting Actor at the 2011 Playhouse West Film Festival.

Scott just wrapped James Franco's feature film adaptation of Cormac McCarthy's acclaimed novel "Child of God" in which he took on the lead role of Lester Ballard. The film is slated for a 2013 release.

Scott is also the creator of the comedic web series "The Vanya Show". He is also collaborating with Ace Norton and "Foster the People" Mark Foster on a film project.

This past summer he produced (along side Danielle Scheid) and directed a documentary titled "Ghost & Goblins" about world champion wrestler Lee Kemp which is scheduled to make it's World Premiere in 2013.

This month Scott wrapped filming in Mississippi, taking on his next acting role in James Franco's feature film adaptation of William Faulkner's acclaimed novel "As I Lay Dying".

Before producing, Lisa Jai worked in film, television, and mainly voice animation in Toronto, Canada. Aside acting, Lisa is an advocate for equal rights and is a member of ACTRA Toronto's Diversity Committee and served on L.A's committee for I AM PWD - a global civil rights campaign bringing focus to physically diverse actors in the mainstream media. A believer in social service, Lisa has led weekly beading groups at a Toronto shelter for women. Lisa weaves her activism into spoken-word, a passion ignited from living and studying amidst Toronto's urban communities. Lisa was a participant of Toronto's inaugural event 'Poetic Fashion', a fundraiser bringing artists together from Toronto's 13 'At Risk' neighborhoods to raise awareness surrounding youth violence.

In 2009, Lisa made the move to Los Angeles, receiving a full scholarship shortly after arriving at The Stella Adler Academy of Acting- LA, whom she is indebted to for her growth - as both an artist and a human being. While studying full time, Lisa produced Adlerfest: a short play festival, each semester. At Stella's, Lisa's credits spanned **Masha** in Anton Chekhov's Three Sisters, **Jane** in Christopher Durang's Dentity Crisis, **Kate Keller** in Arthur Miller's All My Sons, Lennox/Seyton in Shakespeare's Macbeth, Tennesse William's Stella from Streetcar Named Desire and Alma from Summer and Smoke, and Shakespeare's Richard III playing the title role. Lisa's production work began from a sheer belief in and love for live theater: managing house, stage, operating sound and lights for her peers at Stella's. It was here Lisa begot her creative relationships with Tim McNeil, Meghan Cox, Brad Kaz, and most recently formed her own production crew - deemed The A-Team by their colleagues and to whom she personally thanks for the success of this show. This is now the third consecutive production in a row her team have collaborated on together: "To Vivian 'Tzi-Mui' Wang on Graphic Design, Dori a.k.a The Viking, Evan 'Canuck' Riley-Brown, Daniel 'El Argentino' Abreu, Saurab 'KoolKat' Kumar, and Amoreena 'RightHand' Mann on Production - I thank you for making the time to help me when I know you're all full time students and in more need of a spare moment to catch your breath or a helping hand yourselves: Both of which you have continuously given me...For going hard every time this living, breathing, thing called theater, brings us together...For sharing my desire to keep theater alive in an effort to 'better' humanity and 'revolt' in the most poetic motion possible. When Boots finally passes Ruth's devastation and guilt transforms the simple household into a anarchic tribunal where Judge, jury and executioner come in the most unexpected and haunting form imaginable.


DANIGLLO SCHOID
